Kevin Cocks








What the review will look at

• how to help workers get more skills


- how to make sure prices are right

The NDIS needs to do more to keep people with disability safe.




What we already know

- the NDIS and other services do **not** work well together.




We need to make sure people get the supports they need to live a good life.


